- **Opening Prayers** Meeting was opened 7:00 pm following the Faith 5 practice. Thank you was extended to Bob for providing the refreshments.
- Approval of Minutes from Past Council meeting: Lisa Shaffer made a motion to approve the minutes from the last council meeting (Feb. 27, 2017). Pauline seconded. The motion passed and carried.
- **Ministry updates:** Each Ministry shared their Highs and Lows. Please see submitted Ministry meeting minutes for details regarding ministry activities.
 - **Pauline Ahern** (Addictions & Mental Health / Health Support): Ministry did not meet last month. However, they have put some plans into motion.
 - a. "Faces of Change" in Camden NJ (A ministry which provides Christ Centered Intervention Services) – making information available and creating an awareness of the ministry.
 - b. Plans for the larger community plans are forming to help the community of POP and local community with **transitioning into elder care**.
 - Bob Price (Stewardship & Building Community) Ministry did not meet last month. However, the ministry was given the updated 'roles' under their umbrella, which was discussed at the Council Retreat in Feb. 2017.
 - Lisa Schaffer (Family and Education) Ministry did not meet last month. Ministry Highs Good attendance and energy at 'Discipleship Training' classes on Sunday. The Seder meal was well attended. Kids seem to be really enjoying the activities.
 - a. The dates for **Vacation Bible School have been selected: June 24 28**. Guy has decided not to volunteer to run the music program for VBS, but has volunteered to help transition Katy Akinskas (who will be taking over for Guy).
 - b. Jenna Burke organizing the **Mary Magdalene Easter Egg Hunt**. The youth will help stuff and hide.

- Kira Ota (Youth Representative) F.I.S.H. bowl has been well attended (about 5) they hope to plan some activities for April (offsite). The Sr. High kids have volunteered to help with the Easter Pancake Breakfast. Confirmation kids have also been invited to help with pancake breakfast. Youth Sunday is being held June 11. Freshman class is excited to do the service.
- Bill Dennis (Property) Ministry did meet, minutes available upon request. Application for electronic lawn sign still in process. Marshall and Brenda Fisher donated the new gas kitchen stove. Bill has received additional quotes for roof repair. The verbal number in the middle of other quotes. Bill toured the roof and saw the water damage. He feels there will be more / additional work needed to fully repair all aspects of the roof.
- Pam Hann (Social Missions) Ministry did not meet last month. Updates: The Easter Shoes money collection is going very well. The canned food for Bridge of Peace Camden, NJ has been delivered and we had a great response from the congregation. The representative from the Red Cross Blood Drive called because they didn't know we were not doing the April Blood Drive. She wanted to know why and if she could talk to the ministry. Pastor Brett suggested we allow the Red Cross to hold the Blood Drive in April, but without the additional support from Social Ministry (phone calls). The Blood Drive will be held on Wed., April 26 at POP.
- Bob Price (Stewardship & Building Community) Ministry Highs: Soup suppers going great! Youth Drama Gospels well received! We would like to get more people for the ministry. Plan for future music groups? The Stewardship Ministry is looking ahead and planning to do a 'simply giving' Sunday in the Spring and Fall. During the two services – having tables with hosts to explain the ways to give to POP without it costing you anything, ie: *TDBank Affinity Program, Scrip, AmazonSmile and Thrivent Giving*. Explaining to everyone how simple the processes are to sign up and give back to POP without it costing.
