<u>Discussed at Council Meeting:</u> Building Communities: getting ready for Picnic and Harvest Fest. Sign up in narthex. Brandon has agreed to smoke the meat for the community Picnic. Bob Price is putting advertisements in the local papers.

- Stewardship Ministry Minutes Attached. Discussed event held on August 23 with Rev. Scott Schantzenbach.
- Family and Education –Lisa (No Meeting Held). VBS was great and well attended! Still searching for a Sunday School Superintend. Sunday School begins Sept. 24. Sept 10 is the ELCA Day of Service. Marlton police department police car wash and food. Kick off on the 17th Rally Day for Sunday school. Two worship services will start Sept. 24th.
- Youth Kira ELCA Gathering on Informational Meeting is scheduled for Wednesday at 7:00 at POP. About 24 kids are eligible for the ELCA Gathering in Houston.
- <u>Property</u> Bill (Minutes Attached.) Lots of big projects that need to be attended to. Getting
 estimates for pavement, roof, windows, sanctuary window needs 're-caulked', air-conditioner
 needs replaced . . .
- Social Missions Allison and Pam (no minutes) The ministry was packing backpacks the night of council, there were over 115 backpacks. Burlington County will be receiving the overage of backpacks and Family Services. Local family as well. Breakfast was served at New Visions, went really well.
- Worship and Music Sharon (no minutes). Healing service went really well. Good feed back. Pastor Brett asked the music leaders of the church to discuss and plan future music groups. In response to this request, Jo Ann Cubberley organized a 'Summer Choir' and they rehearsed Advent and Christmas Music. There was a large turnout and it was greatly received. Lots of fun. In response to the lack of volunteers for worship service sign-ups, a job board will be put up for both services to help with volunteer jobs. Description and name tags so we know what needs to be done and how to do it.
- SPECIAL GUESTS: Wayne and Mindy Grant from Thrivent Financial

Wayne reminded us to encourage our members to designate their Thrivent Choice Dollars. One of the options for Thrivent Choice is Prince of Peace. We have been using all Choice Donations for the Mortgage Elimination Campaign. The selection of Choice Dollars needs to be resubmitted – once selected, it is not forever selected. Wayne also discussed the Action Teams and encouraged all the ministries to take advantage of this wonderful tool for our missions work. Wayne would like to suggest a 'power meeting of the ministries' to come up with ideas on how to use the Action Teams for each ministry. He said this is a wonderful way to get people to think about the Action Teams and how they can promote and use the tools provided by Thrivent. He would also like to follow up on our Senior Care Workshop with a more focused meeting on the Financial Side of Senior / Elder Care. Perhaps in October with POP. Wayne and Mindy are excited to participate in the Evesham Harvest Festivities and have signed up to help with the Parking Lot Brigade at POP. Wayne talked about using an action team to

help cover some of the cost of the brochures and then also setting up a water station on the grounds. He will follow up with the Building Community Ministry.
